SNAPSHOTS

Foreword

This is a compilation of images taken from from eBay listings – more specifically, from what are called "Vintage Photo Lots" or, less eloquently, "Snapshot Lots". These are listings of groups of photographs which are sold together, usually for very little money, maybe \$10 or \$25 a batch. Sometimes these photos have some sort of thematic or meta-thematic relation to each other (i.e. pictures of men, or women, or trains; pictures from the same decade, or taken with the same type of film), but often there's no real connective tissue whatsoever; they are simply images which the seller possesses, offered as-is to anyone who cares to pay. A typical listing might read something like "VINTAGE PHOTOS LOT of 100 Random B&W and Sepia Snapshots Old Photos" or "Original Vintage Photo Lot of 14 1970s 80s Senior Citizens Old People Snapshot" - a grammar whose strange mixture of glossolalic adjectival overload and programmatic non-specificity will be familiar to anyone who's ever browsed an auction site. In this grammar there is a certain tension, as its impersonality belies the irreducibly personal nature of what is being sold. It attempts to strip out all the baggage of personal contact which these photos silently attest to, leaving only basic, abstract information: dates, colorations, types of subjects. In the pictures of photographs which accompany these breathless strings, we see the same process trying to happen, with varying degrees of success: neutral backdrops, indifferent arrangements, anonymous viewpoints – sometimes we can catch glimpses of the seller's home around the edges, but this is the general pattern. These images, then, capture the transformation of a photograph from a memory, something important to someone, somewhere, for reasons ultimately only accessible to them, back into a simple commodity, with no particular value beyond that inscribed by the figure attached to it. These are simple, artless commercial images, but for there is a sad poetry in their nature. Each one gives us a glimpse of lives, of histories different from our own, histories which for one reason or another have been given up by their caretakers.

The 245 images assembled here is a fraction of a fraction of the potential pool; they were compiled over the course of a few hours on May 29th, 2021, exclusively from active listings. When looking at them, remember that every day more are being uploaded, all alike in their irreducible difference.
































































































































































































































